d) Any other financial matters.

The request from Devon Wildlife Trust for £300 towards the cost of repairs to the hide following storm damage was considered. It was agreed that the Parish Council would donate £300 from the Community Grant Fund.

36 (18/19) TO CONSIDER PLANNING MATTERS

- a) The reserved matters of 1/0466/2018/REM (Wistaria, West Lane) were considered. Cllrs had three concerns: i) about the potential increased height of the residences (and the privacy of the neighbouring properties); ii) about the wildlife survey which had found no evidence of hedgehogs when it is known that hedgehogs are active in the area; iii) about the practicalities of the plan to demolish half the barn.
- b) c) and d). No applications had been granted, withdrawn or refused.
- e) Any other planning matters. Acorn Farm Park. It was reported that the licence was still being worked on. There had been a meeting on 1st June between two Cllrs from

the Parish Council, two residents and the developers to discuss boundary screening issues. It had been a very helpful meeting where it was agreed that it was in everyone's interests to ensure the screening was fit for purpose. There is no timescale for bringing in the lodges.

Aller Road Development. Cllrs had received a request from Collier Planning for a meeting prior to the forthcoming consultation. Dates to be agreed.

37 (18/19) PARISH GROUNDS. Matters Relating to:

- a) Car Park. A discussion was held about the maintenance of the bunds. It was agreed to apply weedkiller around the plants, particularly to target the docks.
 - b) Football field.
 - c) Dennis Cross.
 - Cllr Dunn reported that he was still awaiting the amended RoSPA report. It was agreed that some plastic pigeon deterrents would be put on the bigger swings to prevent fouling by the pigeons.
 - The hire of Dennis Cross for Songs of Praise on 12th August was agreed.
 - d) Memorial Garden. It was agreed to remove the plant pots from the area.

38 (18/19) Maintenance and Traffic Issues

- a) It was agreed that the Clerk would research the Police Commissioner's Grant to find out if it would be possible to apply for a grant for the speed signs on Rectory Road.
- b) Parish / Community Notice Board. Two quotes for commercial replacement had been received. It was agreed to consider this further as a future agenda item.

39 (18/19) Future Website Management

It was felt that the Parish Council needs to take ownership of the website, rather than the current arrangement of using space on the Village website. It was agreed to ask Colin Jones to speak at the Annual Meeting to describe the process and other considerations.
