Which would include the following:- *The timeframe for consultation was too short, with Parish Councils who generally meet once a month having little time to fully understand and review the policy and then form a response. *The proposed policy was long and difficult to read. *The overall policy of the Parish Council is they have the right to approve or reject wind power development in its area.

Dolton Parish Council has a Policy of considering applications relating to the Parish on an individual case by case basis. Parish Councils response to be placed on the noticeboard and website.
